Quiet Lanes Project in Hasketon


Dear Resident,

Hasketon Parish Council is exploring the possibility of designating some roads in the Parish as 'Quiet Lanes' and would like to get your feedback.

This is part of a Suffolk County-wide project which is being funded substantially by grants from Suffolk County and East Suffolk District Councils.

Quiet Lanes

- are lanes where walkers, horse riders and cyclists can enjoy the lanes in greater safety and encourage drivers to watch out for more vulnerable road users.
- help to maintain the rural nature and tranquility of our lanes for the enjoyment of all.
- do not impose traffic restrictions, and are not enforced, but advisory signs are placed on each lane to clearly show motorists that the road is a shared space.



In Hasketon, we have identified Chimney Pot and Pinners Lanes, Bealings, Top/Low and Shrubbery Roads and Riverside as suitable for Quiet Lanes.
